WSMTA CONFERENCE HISTORY

WSMTA's parent organization, Northwest Music Teachers Association, covened yearly (except for one) from 1908–

1915. After the decision of forming the Washington State Music Teachers Association, the first state conference was held December 28 - 30, 1915 at the Hotel Washington Annex in Seattle. It was in conjunction with the State Federation of Musical Clubs, as it was hoped by meeting jointly it would serve their mutual interests and build a strong community for all musicians. The conference was full of musical selections of solo voice and piano. choruses, and trios. Topics of sessions included: Eurythmics: Musical Diction; Orchestration, Memorization, and Music Education. There were also committee reports, revisions of the constitution and elections.

FUN FACT! The banquet dinner cost 0.75 per plate!! The Waldorf Hotel offered special rates at \$1/single and \$1.25/double without bath. With a bath was \$1.50! Even special transportation was arranged. The railway companies were offering discounted fares, and members were able to purchase "Railroad Certificates".

FUN FACT! The first piano competitions held at the convention was 1922.

FUN FACT! The practice of engaging master class teachers was inaugurated at the 1928 Convention.

FUN FACT! At the 1929 conference held in Seattle, there were 300 people at the *banquet!!*

In 1937, it was decided to hold biennial rather than annual state conventions, beginning the following year, and that during the intervening odd-numbered years, one-day District Conferences would be held at a place and date to be chosen by each of the three District Vice-Presidents in consultation with the Chapters of their respective Districts. This would be "for the purpose of business, discussion of district problems as they relate to the whole State, and promotion of closer relations between the Chapters and the State Officers."

Only three District Conferences were held from 1939 until 1943. In staying with the odd-numbered year, these conferences from 1945 on were changed to be called the Delegate Assembly. It was to be held for the purpose of furthering and correlating the state programs and to provide opportunity for voting in general sessions on new business proposed by the Executive Board. No elections or changes of the constitution would take place but resignations and vacancies would be acted upon. Each Chapter would have 3 voting delegates but any number of visiting delegates (or members). At this assembly, appointed committees met to set up the graduated ranks comprising the Musicrafter plan of study. Groundwork was also laid for the auditions program and Teacher Merit Plan.

FUN FACT! At the 1948 convention an induction ceremony for new members was presented and adopted, and the first official induction ceremony took place before the assembled gathering.

With the organization of the MTNA Western Division, the first Western Division Conference was 1951. It was to be held every other year and rotate locations between the Western States.

FUN FACT! This first conference was held at the Multnomah Hotel outside Portland with 502 in attendance, 90 from Washington.

In 1955 MTNA went to biennial conventions as well. It was thought by having both national and divisional associations meetings it would strain the resources of members and officers.

FUN FACT! The world's fair was held in Seattle in 1962. That year WSMTA's Biennial Conference, in Bellingham, reflected the theme of the 21st Century - "The World of Music - Today and Tomorrow". Nearly 200 attended!

Due to the change at National, the Western Division Conference and the state Delegate Assemblies wound up being in the same even numbered years. In 1964, 1966 and 1970, when the Western Division was in Missoula, Bellingham and Missoula, the *Delegate Assembly* was cut to "One Day Assemblies". This enabled WSMTA to still take care of business while supporting the Western Division and encouraging members to attend.

FUN FACT! The 50th Anniversary was 1965! 135 members attended the conference; Registration was \$5.00 and

\$2.50 for students; The banquet was \$2.50.

The 1970's brought more changes: MTNA went back to holding annual conventions, the Northwest Division was formed, and the Division conventions gave way to being the MTNA Division Competitions. The last Division Conference I could track was in 1977 when the NW and SW Divisions met together in Honolulu! Then WSMTA finally followed suit and in 1979 voted to discontinue "Assemblies" in favor of a yearly convention.

FUN FACT! 1990 was the First Student Convention held in Walla Walla.

As far as records have shown, there are only three years in our 100 years of an association that some sort of a state convention was not held. Perhaps due to world events there was not one recorded for 1917. The other two years were 1972 and 1979, when the National Conferences were held in Portland and Seattle.

One of the largest attended conferences in the last 50+ years was in 1962. About 1/3 of our membership was there. If we were able to have 1/3 of our membership attend this year, we would need over 300. Wouldn't that be amazing!! In the "President's Message" of the monthly CLARIONS, all of the past presidents have written about the importance of attending YOUR state conferences. I would like to share some quotes by Lois Whitner (1958-1960 WSMTA President):

"One of the greatest privileges which you have as a member of WSMTA is attendance at the annual conventions." and "To the teacher who is new in the profession, it offers many opportunities to benefit from the experience of others. To the teacher long in the field, it offers the freshness of viewpoint of the younger teachers. To all of us, it offers an opportunity both to receive and to give."

tion and Performance, Motivation and Practice, and Memory and Performance. Each chapter contains a summary page at the end for quick reference and projects for new and experienced teachers. Not only a great college piano pedagogy text, but also this could be used as a study book for a local association program series.

Frequently, when I read through the questions posed on various Facebook groups about Piano Pedagogy, I see questions about what, when, and how to teach intermediate and advanced repertoire and technique. This book answers those questions and many more.

The first chapter, "Teaching Students Beyond the Elementary Levels," gives one of the finest synopses I have seen on the skills and concepts of Early Intermediate, Intermediate, Late Intermediate and Early Advanced Levels, and how to correlate method book and traditional repertoire books. The second chapter on How Students Learn is very clear, and well-thought out, covering all the major approaches to learning. Chapter three on Transfer Students is worth its weight in gold, giving various interview scenarios and suggestions for curriculum.

The Rhythm chapter presents a number of exercises to develop rhythmic fluency and how to teach complex rhythmic configurations. Suggestions for the de-

velopment of reading skills are also included in this chapter.

Tension in technique and in performance is discussed in the Technique chapter with an excellent section on recognizing tension in elementary and intermediate students. For teachers just moving students into intermediate repertoire, the teaching suggestions for each musical period are exceptional, and the charts on how to classify the repertoire advancement levels are very complete.

The remaining chapters are just as exciting--filled with pertinent information in a very readable style. Volume II and its predecessor Volume I definitely belong in your libraries.


