#### Michiko Morita Miyamoto Biography

Michiko Morita Mivamoto, born in Seattle, Washington, was the second daughter of parents who had emigrated from Japan to the United States and had strong interests in music and art. Michiko's innate talent for music became evident very early. When she was still a year too young for the age requirement of the Cornish School, today the Cornish College of the Arts, the school agreed to hear her. She was auditioned and accepted by Miss Nellie Cornish herself and entered as their youngest student, soon becoming a star at the school regularly called upon for performances. She was also known as an accompanist for her older sister who

If you can't think of any, perhaps you should explore some of the programs available as a WSMTA/MTNA member, and become INVOLVED!

At our Conference in Bellingham I had the privilege to hear how the WSMTA Student Grants Program created a "ripple effect" from one of our member teachers. (I'll avoid using names to maintain anonymity.) She told me of a hardworking student with musical talent, whose father had suffered several strokes during the winter, causing him to be hospitalized for several weeks, followed by rehab and therapy that continues to this day. This illness had a devastating effect on the family since the father was self-employed with no other employees except the mother, his wife. Because their livelihood was gone, (at least for a time and still is) they had no option but to consider discontinuing piano lessons. This teacher did everything she could and helped them continue through the year. A Clarion article about WSMTA Student Study Grants caught the teacher's eye. Long story short, the traumatized family applied for, and was awarded a grant from the WSM-TA Study Grant Committee chaired by Connie Hungate. The grant will make it possible for this student to continue piano study this year.

However, the story doesn't end there; listen to the *ripple effect* in action! In an effort to inspire other students and honor the efforts of this particular family and student, at her studio recital, our teacher gave an overview of the student's situation, how he continued diligently in spite of the situation and was also chosen student of the year at his school. She told how WSMTA had awarded her student a grant for this fall to continue his piano study. Because she wanted to inspire dedication in her students, not solicit for

the family, she was totally overwhelmed at what took place after the festivities. The father of another student, who is in the military, hearing his own daughter perform in a recital for the first time because of his military duty, handed her \$100.00 cash, saying he also wanted to contribute to this student's music study. Later in the parking lot as she was leaving, a couple handed her a check for this same student. Telling about the WSMTA Grant began a positive *ripple effect*. What good *ripples* can you begin?



How long has it been since your chapter has invited non-members to your concerts or workshops? Could your chapter use new life and ideas? Then consider inviting more non-members to every chapter or district event; it takes many invites to find those who will be inspired to join! Your chapter could possibly be the recipient of \$200.00 if you have the highest percentage or the largest number of new members join before April 1, 2013!

As you send ripples out to non-members remember you can invite them to attend your chapter meetings recitals, events, and your district conference, the Outstanding Artists Competition and MTNA Performance Competition which will take place November 8 - 11 are also open to the public. The competitions provide the opportunity to be inspired with great student performances and at the same time allow you to contribute your help. Assistance is needed at both events to monitor, register and time performers among other things. If you live in Western Washington, especially near Tacoma, Janice Smith, Patti Ray and Julie Swienty will want to hear from you! Don't forget you can invite others to attend also and be inspired by these fabulous competitions!

# Foundation Fellow Nominee Michiko Morita Miyamoto Biography (continued)

studied violin at Cornish, as a chamber music performer, and as one who excelled in music theory.

In due course, young Michiko was assigned to the renowned teacher, Madame Berthe Poncy Jacobson, and studied with her throughout her pre-college and college years. Michiko feels she owes to Mrs. Jacobson much of what she ultimately achieved at the piano, especially in her understanding of music. At age sixteen, Michiko graduated from Broadway High School as Salutatorian, left Cornish School and entered the University of Washington as a music major. The School of Music required that she take piano lessons for credit, but finding no one at the University with whom she wanted to study, she asked to continue her studies with Mrs. Jacobson, with University credit. Her request was granted, and a year later, the University astutely chose to hire Mrs. Jacobson for its own faculty. Mrs. Jacobson went on to become the legendary head of the piano department until her retirement.

Michiko graduated from the University of Washington with Magna Cum Laude honors and a Phi Beta Kappa key. But perhaps more important to her musical advancement was the honor of being named to the women's music honorary sorority, Mu Phi Epsilon, for the friends she made in Mu Phi were formative in developing her identity as a musician.

**TEACHING** Michiko began teaching piano in the 1930's while in high school and the university, which helped pay for her own music lessons. The fifteen to twenty students she had developed before World War II were all from the local Japanese community. The outbreak of World War II came in December 1941, and she married Shotaro Frank Miyamoto late that month, without waiting for their intended February wedding date. She and Frank were evacuated to the Tule Lake Relocation Center with other West Coast residents of Japanese ancestry. There, to her amazement and delight, she discovered that one of the families had brought with them an upright piano that they offered for her use. Another family had brought a large collection of 78 rpm records. A teacher to the core, she quickly resumed teaching piano, and organized and presented weekly Saturday night concerts of the recordings, complete with explanations of the music to enrich the experience for the internees, until she and Frank moved from the "camp" to Chicago in the latter years of the war. While her husband completed his doctorate, Michiko taught Japanese language classes at the University of Chicago and taught piano to children of the University's faculty. The couple returned to Seattle at the end of the war.

From the beginning, Mrs. Miyamoto used private spring and fall recitals as motivational goals around which to organize her students' study and to teach stage presence. In the postwar years, as a member of the Seattle and Washington State Music Teachers Associations, the Music Teachers National Association, and the Eastside Music Teachers' Eastside Festival, she used their annual competitions as further means of motivating her students and organizing their development. The regularity with which her students won recognition and honors at these events, including her two children John, Jane, and niece, Anne Morita, was the early basis on which Michiko established her name as a piano teacher in the Seattle area. ...
