The board approved a well-planned schedule and budget for the June WSMTA Conference! You should know that our Outstanding Artist Competition awarded monetary prizes for three places each in the junior and senior divisions. We were able to provide travel grants to those WS-MTA Competition winners who went to NW Division. And, we will do the same for the seventeen students who have been chosen from our state to compete at the national level. Those seventeen students are testimony to the excellent work taking place in the teaching arena. We approved grant mon-ey for the WSU collegiate chapter (which they are very excited about) to assist in their travel expenses for their presenta-tion at the National Conference; what an honor! We approved waiving fees for registered MusicLink student participation in Young Composers Project, Musicianship Exams, and OAC. Your board also approved five additional certification grants for teachers. I believe we have now awarded over sixty certification grants at \$100.00 each! We approved the request for a "Small Chapter Grant". The district conference reports indicated that outstanding educational opportunities are being or have been offered by the districts during the fall and winter. That and more, was accomplished because of the foresight of those leaders who have previously responsibly filled leadership positions!

Remember, your chapter could receive a \$200.00 award for greatest percentage increase in membership, or greatest overall numerical increase. The deadline is April 1, 2012. I see new members listed each month in the Clarion, however we want to encourage even more of our non-member friends to enjoy the opportunities that WSMTA offers. Where else can you find such great camaraderie with musicians, opportunities to perform, student programs that you don't have to organize alone, excellent articles provided in the AMT, potential grants, awards and financial assistance on the state and national levels? I don't know of anything comparable for the \$10.00 -\$15.00 a month it costs in dues!

Talk about opportunities – to be graced with Angela Cheng at our June Conference (see additional articles in this Clarion) is nothing less than fabulous and

awesome. We are fortunate to have a person of her caliber participate at our conference with us. I share here just a couple of numerous quotes I've found to inspire you. "Rather than treating the concerto as a vehicle for self-projection, Cheng appeared to actually live its music." Montreal Gazette. "Cheng's technique is smooth and brilliant, but the most significant factor may have been her passion for the music. It appeared to flow through her with incredible intensity, even when she wasn't playing...Cheng puts something of herself fully into each note she plays, and it seems a privilege to be permitted to spend time in the world emanating from her piano." Leader-Post.

Take this opportunity to see Angela Cheng up close performing. Invite your music lover friends to her concert. Be inspired during her master classes, and share some of her thoughts at our conference in June! We owe a great *Thanks* to Karen Scholten, Meg Krieg and their team of NW Washington members who are preparing a conference with special opportunities not only for pianists but all musicians!

STUDENT STUDY GRANT PROGRAM

Call for Student Study Grant Applications

Established nine years ago with a bequest from the Lois Whitner estate, the WSMTA Student Study Grant program will be accepting requests for applications for the 2012-2013 year. The purpose of the program is to provide financial assistance for continued private study to music students who demonstrate financial need and who show serious commitment to music study. The following guidelines apply:

- 1. The grant is open to music students currently in **grades 7 11** (note change) who have studied a minimum of 4 years and whose teachers are members (of at least 12 months standing) of WSMTA.
- 2. The applicant will be considered on a basis of financial need and commitment to music study.
- 3. The applicant must have participated in WSMTA sponsored adjudications
- 4. Grants up to \$1,000 may be awarded. The applicant must explain specifically and in detail how the funds will be used. The grant will be for a period of not more than one year and may be approved for additional years at the discretion of the Student Grant Committee. Students seeking grant renewal must submit another application to the committee for consideration.
- 5. The grant may be used to offset the cost of music lessons, theory, or composition classes, or tuition for music camps.
- 6. The grant will be sent directly to the teacher or camp/program director.

Summer Learning Opportunities for Organ

Do you have a student who would like to learn more about the organ? Do you have an advanced organ student who would benefit from a program taught by artist faculty? Perhaps you or another adult you know would finally like to know what all of those knobs and buttons with foreign words do on your organ. Baffled about how to play the pedals? Maybe you have a student who would like to know how a pipe organ is built. The American Guild of Organists (AGO) sponsors a variety of 4-6 day workshops every summer to teach teenagers and adults about the Pipe Organ Encounters (POEs) offer a rewarding opportunity to learn more about the pipe organ and its construction, instruction with experienced faulty, visits to hear and play outstanding instruments, and the chance to meet and interact with peers who share an interest in the King of Instruments. Detailed information about POEs may be found at the AGO website: www.agohq.org. There are application deadlines for some of the programs, and some of them fill fast, so now is the time to plan for summer.

STUDENT TEACHER PROGRAM

High School Student Teachers

It's 4 pm on a Sunday afternoon and I'm at a local coffee house taking orders for mocha's, lattés and hot chocolates. Sitting around the table, sipping our beverages, sometimes it's hard to get a word

in edgewise with the 4 or 5 high school students who are meeting with me to discuss their student teacher issues. Other times, the meeting is in my studio where we work at the piano, but today it's a more casual, social setting. In between the talk about AP classes, prom, college applications and drivers ed, the students manage to swap stories about their 2nd grade student having trouble with scales. or the parent of their student who is not paying the tuition on time. The sense of community and partnership for these young teachers is an important aspect of the Student Teacher program in my studio. Is a Student Teacher program right for your studio?

Do you have advanced high school or middle school students that would make a good teacher? Are they comfortable around small children?

Do you have high school students who need an extra reason to stay involved in piano?

Are you willing and able to take on an extra task in your own studio?

There are a number of teachers in WS-MTA who have successful student teacher programs, and each teacher has their own ideas of how to educate the high school students in pedagogy, psychology and small business practices. This article provides a brief look into how I operate my student teacher program and has no reflection on how other teachers do this.

Janice Smith Piano Studio Student Teacher Program Description

Most of the students who study with student teachers come from an overflow in my own studio, or from referrals of current families that know of the program. Once in a while a student teacher will come up with their own student, but not often.

It starts with a phone interview followed by an on site interview. If everyone is agreeable then a lesson schedule is set up. The lessons take place at the home of the student or at the student teacher's house. If the student teacher travels to the student's home, an additional fee is charged.

For first-time student teachers, I schedule an initial training session and go over the first 2 or 3 lessons in a mock-teaching setup. I have learned to play-act as a beginner student very well! Additional training sessions are scheduled as needed.

I have a written Student Teacher Studio Policy that I discuss in detail with the student teacher and the prospective family. You can view this policy on my website: www.northspokanepiano.com/lessons. It

explains fees, group lessons, recitals and expectations. I carefully explain to parents that the policies are not set by the student teacher and questions or issues should be addressed to me as the master teacher.

I charge the student teacher \$2 for each lesson they teach with a separate line item on their monthly tuition statement. All of their students are included in my studio activities of group lessons and recitals. If the student teacher has had a student for more than one year, they join WSMTA as a student teacher and enter their student(s) in adjudications. All the student teachers are expected to attend the group lessons and recitals of their student (in addition to their own). If they "forget" to attend an activity they are charged my full rate for the lesson in which their student is involved (yes, that has happened), although their student is not. The student teachers are responsible for billing, music procurement, and all other business that is conducted. I feel it is very important that they experience the "business" end of teaching, too.

I meet with my student teachers once a month – sometimes in a coffee shop and sometimes in my studio. It depends on the topics we are covering and the need for a piano.

At the end of the school year, I schedule a conference lesson with the student teacher, the student and the parent(s). The student teacher writes an evaluation on a form that I provide and we meet for about 30 minutes to discuss progress, problems, changes and goals. As the year goes by I also check in with the parents to be sure they are happy with the student teacher and the progress of their child.

Problems have arisen over the years, and I have learned how to educate my student teachers in ways to adapt, communicate with parents, teach when they are tired and distracted, and attune to the quickly changing needs of an individual student!

I hope to address some of the potential problems and solutions in future Clarion articles. In the meantime, please send me YOUR stories, ideas, problems and successes. The sharing process is one of the biggest advantages to our membership in WSMTA!

You'll smile as you MARCH straight to the bank with the \$100.00 grant from WSMTA offsetting part of the \$200.00 certification application fee!

For those of you already MARCHing along towards certification, don't hesitate to contact me if you have questions, need help, or encouragement. I love hearing from you. And to those of you who are already certified, don't forget to send in your yearly renewal information to MTNA.

Animals Around Us – An Artistic Early Elementary Collection for Solo Piano, by Elizabeth W. Greenleaf. The FJH Music Company Inc., 2011. www.fjhmusic.com/; 24 pp., \$5.50.

This piano collection is a thoughtful and attractive tool for teachers and elementary students. Greenleaf brings both creativity and enthusiasm to each piece, picturing different animals throughout the set. They are titled according to the mood and character of each song, encouraging imagination and musicianship.

Short, useful and some good-humored explanations are given at the beginning of each piece. In *The Playful Puppy*, the slurs and the rests help to "make the music sound bumpy and jumpy, like a playful puppy".

Greenleaf's compositions explore different ranges of the keyboard and an early introduction to pedaling. Technical challenges are introduced, such as the use of accidentals and quick shifting of hand positions.

These pieces are both exciting and accessible, and they will certainly promote artistry for the developing pianist.

Life is Good - An Artistic Intermediate Collection for Solo Piano by Kevin Costley. The FJH Music Company Inc., 2011. 23 pp., \$5.50. www.fjhmusic.com/

Kevin Costley's compositions in this set are well constructed with the proper

amount of musical and technical challenges. They are written in accessible key signatures, with the use of occasional accidentals throughout, adding interesting colors to the harmonies. Students will explore rhythmic syncopations, hand shifting and crossing over, some elaborate pedaling and a variety of touches and articulations.

Life is Good gives the intermediate student lots of opportunities for expression and imagination. These are musically joyful and inspiring pieces, intended to focus on positive life outcomes.

Pets Will Play... When the Family's Away by Nancy Lau. The FJH Music Company Inc., 2011. 24 pp., \$5.50. www.fjhmusic.com/

This charming piano suite combines storytelling, poetry and music. It contains eight solos, which could be performed in a piano recital by different students from late elementary to early intermediate levels. Nancy Lau also offers some performance ideas that will help enhance and make the recital experience even more enjoyable and entertaining for the audience, teachers and students.

Lau explores the use of different dynamics, tone colors, articulations, touches, pedaling and rhythmic variety. The pieces are an excellent tool for technical development and musical artistry, as well as creating an imaginative and exciting recital program.




