New New Year Resolutions

We are so quick to admire everything fast: high-speed cars, race winners, fast thinkers, fast fingers... We shop faster when the store manager plays lively music in the background. We even applaud faster after an uptempo performance.

Then why does it take such a long time to learn a fast piece? Yes, time plays tricks with our minds.

It took me four years to master the correct hand position, 1st through 4th grade, until I noticed my teacher had stopped reminding me: "Round fingers! Watch the flat fingers!" It seemed then that four years is a very long time to learn a skill. In comparison with forty years of playing piano, it "happened" only "yesterday"!

This month is the end of a school year. Didn't it pass by with breathtaking speed? Going from one piece to the next, one festival to another, competitions, adjudications, recitals, winning, losing, learning... Now, it is a good time to find the loose ends. Thinking back, I wonder how was this year different from the year before, and the year before that, and earlier? When I proudly say: "I have many years of teaching experience", do I remember each year? Sadly, no. This year I decided to make a different New School Year resolution: make this year unforgettable in my studio!

As every teacher knows, implementing any idea takes steps and outlines. I have decided to focus on five resolutions to get to my main goal: make this year different!

First, I will not teach my lessons the same way I did last year. The students get used to lesson format very quickly and so do I. How do we find room for stimulation through spontaneity? I find that story-telling does wonders for teaching, just like spices do for cooking. Using imagination refreshes anything we teach and makes it memorable. Let's flex our imagination muscle, and students will follow!

Second, I will learn a new technology to enhance my teaching. I often feel that my personal knowledge of technology is outdated and inferior to my students' use of it. But then I realized that it does not need to be expensive new software or iPad. It does not need to be an elaborate blog or Facebook posts that can easily backfire or seem generic. Small steps and attention to products available to us go a long way. Using technology in your own unique and imaginative way will surprise and attract students' attention.

Third, instead of bringing "old baggage" and stereotypes of overscheduled students, I will give every student a fresh start regardless of what happened last year. What I've learned is that every person has "ups" and "downs," good students stop practicing as they used to, other students rise to unexpected heights. I love that about the teaching profession; it is never a smooth ride. One point that is unchangeable is my high expectations of a finished project and musical growth of a student, no matter how long it takes to get

Fourth, I will not be afraid to put myself out of the comfort zone by learning a new skill, anything new to me, and share it with my students. For many of them, seeing us trying, pushing, and being frustrated, is a great learning experience. It is something we can always relate to when students have a hard time in their studying or practicing. When a task is accomplished, we will celebrate together!

Fifth, I will connect more with colleagues in my chapter, state, and around the country and the world. Sometimes teaching in isolation seems easier but it does not mean that it is right. Connection with other teachers provides a wealth of information, inspirational ideas, and emotional support. If we show our students that we connect with other musicians and teachers, they will feel more engaged and excited to share in that experience. The great opportunity to see old friends and make new ones is coming up: WSMTA conference in Olympia!

In conclusion, I would like to share with you an anonymous poem that I found accidently online. It brings back good memories and looks into the future. The next year in our studios is going to be unforgetable!

That is Why I Teach Music

NOT because I expect you to major in music.

NOT because I expect you to play or sing all your life.

NOT so you can relax or have fun.

BUT- So you will be human

So you will recognize beauty

So you will be sensitive

So you will be closer to an infinite beyond this world

So you will have something to cling to

So you will have more love, more compassion, more gentleness, more good...

in short, more life.

Winners of both divisions will be invited to perform in the Washington State Winners Recital at the June 2011 WSMTA Conference. **Entry deadline: September 15, 2010**

The WSMTA Outstanding Artist Competition was established in 2005 to provide another opportunity for talented pianists from our state. It runs concurrently with the MTNA Competition but is not part of the MTNA Competition. The Outstanding Artist Competition can serve as a positive initial step for students wanting to compete in the MTNA Performance Competitions in future years.

WSMTA expresses its sincere appreciation to University of Puget Sound for use of their facilities during our competition.

General Rules:

- ■Decisions of competition judges are final.
- ■A first-place winner may not participate in the same competition category again.
- ■Competition performances are open to the public.
- ■Audio or video recording and photography of the competitions are strongly discouraged.

Entrant Information:

- ■Entrants must be a resident of Washington State or a student of a WSMTA member.
- ■All entry fees are nonrefundable.
- ■Competition financial obligations are the responsibility of the entrant and teacher.
- ■Application Entry deadline via EMAIL is September 15, 2010. Checks must be mailed and postmarked by September 15, 2010.

WSMTA Member Teachers:

- Current membership dues for MTNA and WSMTA must be paid on or before September 15, 2010.
- ■A teacher may not enter the same student in both WSMTA OAC and MTNA Performance Competitions in the same year.
- Teacher entry fees: \$40.00 for first student and \$20 for each additional student entered. Member Competition fees must be paid on or before September 15, 2010.

WSMTA Nonmember Teachers:

■Nonmembers have the option of becoming a member of MTNA and WSMTA or paying a Teacher Entry Fee of \$150.00 for first student and \$20.00 for each additional student. Nonmember Competition fees must be paid on or before September 15, 2010.

2010 Repertoire Requirements:

Junior Division: Age: 11-14 as of January 1, 2011 **Senior Division:** Age: 15-18 as of January 1, 2011.

Entry Fee: \$60.00 Entry Fee: \$75.00

Maximum performance time: twenty (20) minutes.

Maximum performance time: twenty-five (25) minutes

- Each program must contain stylistically varied compositions from at least two contrasting style periods.
- Memorization is required for all repertoire.
- Concerto performances are not permitted.
- Compositions for prepared piano are not permitted.
- Transcriptions are allowed.

Competition Music:

- ■All entrants must abide by the federal Copyright Law. Photocopies are strongly discouraged.
- ■Entrants must provide the judges one score for each work listed on the application form.
- Measures must be numbered at the beginning of each system.
- ■Students must perform the repertoire listed on the original application.
- Teachers should verify that all repertoire listings are correct before submission of the application.
- ■No changes in repertoire are allowed.

Competition Performance Procedures:

- ■No minimum time limit.
- ■Programmed music may exceed maximum time limit.
- ■Performance will be stopped when maximum time is reached (does not affect results).
- ■Student chooses first selection; judges determine remaining order of performance.

It is the responsibility of the **teacher**, **entrant and parent or guardian** to abide by all rules and regulations for the WSMTA Outstanding Artist Competition. Failure to meet this responsibility will result in the disqualification of the entrant.



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
