# President's Corner



It's astounding how rapidly the past nine months have gone by; I feel like I've lived through a time-lapsed photography experience. Late last July I gave you a description of the birds feeding and teaching their

young around our bird feeders and bird bath. It seems I've barely turned my head and now humming birds and other birds are appearing in greater numbers already. I think their campaign was "Each One Reach One" as well! Last August/ September we were setting out to begin our teaching year! Now, we can look back and assess how the year went! Did we reach goals, including workshops, concerts, performances for ourselves and recitals, adjudications, festivals, musicianship exams, competitions etc. for our students?

"Each One Reach One" Campaign resulted in over 50 new members between September 1, 2011 and April 1, 2012. BRAVO to Enumclaw and Kitsap County Chapters! You added the highest percentage and most new members in the state during that period, according to MTNA membership numbers. Enumclaw increased by 29% (GREAT GOING), and Kitsap Chapter added nine new members (EXCELLENT)! Both chapters are the recipients of \$200.00, given with the intent that it be used to assist a member or members to attend the conference. This year about one in twenty-two members "reached" a new person to join WSMTA; let's see if we can do better and refresh WSMTA with 100 new members next vear!

# 2013 MTNA Foundation Fellow Nominee Judith Schoepflin

Judith Schoepflin, NCTM, is Director of Keyboard Studies at Whitworth University in Spokane, Washington. A native of Bremerton, Washington, she holds both Bachelors and Masters degrees in piano performance and vocal performance from the University of Idaho. While there, she was a recipient of the Theodore Presser

Award, the Phi Kappa Phi award for outstanding academic achievement, and the Pi Kappa Lambda award for outstanding musical achievement. As a Doctoral Fellow at the University of North Texas, she received her doctorate in Piano Performance, where she was a student of Richard Cass and Joseph Banowetz.

Active as both a solo and chamber music performer, she has performed with numerous orchestras in the Northwest and Canada. As a member of the Mühlfeld Clarinet Trio, she performed to critical acclaim in the U.S., Europe, Canada, and Mexico. This group recorded for Laurel Records and Irish National Radio, and was featured on United Airlines in-flight The trio also performed for MTNA Conferences in Washington D.C., Portland, OR, and Miami, FL. Judith has been a regular presenter on various topics for her local Spokane chapter of WSM-TA, as well as serving as performer and presenter at several Washington State Music Teacher Conferences. Recently, she presented the topic, "Can I Sue My Piano Teacher for Malpractice?" Serving as liaison and host of many WSMTA State and Northwest Division MTNA Competitions, she is also area coordinator for the National Guild of Piano Teacher Auditions.

She is active as a master clinician and adjudicator for a variety of state and regional adjudications and competitions. This includes WSMTA State Competitions and MTNA Division Competitions in Washington, Idaho, Montana and Utah.

Judith enjoys teaching students of all ages. Her private and collegiate students regularly perform in master classes, participate in WSMTA adjudications, and have won numerous regional competitions. Many of her students have gone on to receive graduate degrees in piano, and are teaching independently and/or in colleges.

While a faculty member at Washington State University, she was awarded "Woman of the Year in the Arts" for her contribution to women's studies through research and performance of women composers. She has actively promoted music by women through lectures and recitals, and is founder and director of Whitworth University's annual series, Women Composers: The Untapped Source. This series has presented music by over 140 women from around the globe, and includes works from the 9th C. to the pre-

sent; ranging from piano works to full symphonic band. Her study in this field has lead to the acquisition of over 1,000 scores.

When not involved with music, Judith enjoys gardening, reading and sports, once serving as a little league baseball coach.
