WSMTA Outstanding Artist Competition - Nov. 4-6

The September 13th deadline for WSMTA Outstanding Artist Competition Applications is fast approaching. (It was mistakenly printed as Sept. 15 on the cover of the June CLARION.) This year's competition will be held November 4 - 6th, 2011 at Central Washington University in Ellensburg, Washington. This competition runs concurrently with the MTNA Competition. The Junior Piano Division is open to students 11 - 14 years of age and the Senior Piano Division is for students 15 - 18 years of age, both as of January 1, 2011. We invite students who enjoy competition or who may be considering the MTNA Competition in future years to participate. Cash prizes are awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in each division. Winners of both divisions will also be invited to perform in the Washington State Winners Recital at the June 2012 Conference at Western Washington University in Bellingham.

The application form can be found at www.wsmta.net. Do not be intimidated by the process! It has been designed so that you will be walked through each step, and is easy to complete. Here is a check list of information you will need to complete the application (please be accurate and double check your typing):

- 1. Student's first and last name
- 2. Parent or guardian's name
- 3. Student's address (street, city, zip)
- 4. Student's home phone number
- 5. Student or parent's cell number (if they have one)
- 6. Student's birthdate, using dashes in

- between numbers. Example: 06-12-1999
- 7. Complete title (include Opus number, BWV number, etc.) of each piece
- 8. Composer (last name only)
- 9. Length of the piece *Again, accuracy is important: the time you submit will be the time allowed* and there can be no changes or additions once the application is submitted. Again, format is specific: for an 8 minute 20 second long piece, enter 00:08:20, which represents (hours:minutes: seconds)

To begin, select member login from the home menu on the left (near the bottom). To create a login, you will need to have your MTNA membership number (if you have not paid MTNA dues, do so as soon as possible; otherwise, you will not be able to login or register for the competition).

Once you have submitted the application online, please print two copies. Mail one copy along with a check, postmarked no later than **September 13th** to me at **29118 152nd Ave. SE, Kent, WA 98042** (you cannot pay online). Keep one copy for your records.

- Teacher State entry form, found online at www.wsmta.net website, must be completed by September 16, 2011 and sent to Bill McKay, 1811 Birch Ave. Richland, WA 99352-2451. You must include your check (\$40. for one student and \$20 for each additional student), payable to WSMTA.
- Student MTNA Competition applications must be entered online by midnight September 13, 2011. Please check www.mtna.org for instructions.
- All entry fees are nonrefundable

- · WSMTA/MTNA Performance Competitions are open. All teachers, parents and students are welcome to attend. Instrumental Competition are for: Junior **level** age: 11 – 14 as of Jan 1, 2011: piano, string and woodwinds; Senior **level** age: 15 – 18 as of Jan 1, 2012: brass, piano, string, voice and woodwinds; Piano duet (one piano/four hands) age: 11 - 18 as of January 1, 2012; **Young Artist level** age: 19 - 26 as of Jan 1, 2012: brass, piano, string, voice, woodwind; Chamber music, average age of ensemble must be 18 -26 as of Jan 1, 2012, two tracks are string and wind.
- Composition Competition for Elementary, Junior, Senior, and Young Artist levels.

What's New in Adjudications for 2012

Congratulations to all of the teachers

and chapters who participated in a very successful Adjudications year in 2011! There was increased participation across the state--and while accommodating higher than expected student number makes for some creative planning on the part of chapter chairs--the students, teachers and adjudicators really pulled it off!

Many teachers are probably already in the planning stages for 2012 Adjudications, and if you have not previously entered, please try out this outstanding performance opportunity in your studio. I would like to highlight a few changes and clarifications that were discussed during the conference in the Tri-Cities this last June.

First of all – we will be paying our Adjudicators an additional \$2 per hour this coming year, but in order to provide this well-deserved raise, we will be raising fees by \$2 in each level. All other fees will remain the same. Go to the WSMTA website, under Forms to download the 2011-2012 Teacher's Booklet which has the specific amounts for each level.

Please be sure that you are using the current forms. Many teachers and chapter chairs have copies of forms on their computers from many years ago that are no longer applicable. With an event of this size, it is vital to have the correct information submitted to the many chairs responsible for registration, fees, honors recital entry, etc., etc. The current year, 2011–2012, will be listed at the top of every form.

It was brought to my attention over the last year, that there is some misunderstanding regarding the requirement for the piano division as it relates to memorized music. Please remember that piano adjudications require two pieces performed from memory. WSMTA realizes that at times there are unusual circumstances which may prevent a student from having the music memorized, so in order to accommodate those special situations and have students receive an educational experience, WSMTA will allow students to participate with music only if there have been unusual situations such as illness or family emergency, and these students will *not* receive a Certificate of Participation.

WSMTA is working towards creating online adjudications entry capabilities. In 2011-2012, the Moses Lake and Spokane Chapters will be participating in a trial program for teacher registration and chapter summary form submission. John

Webster, WSMTA Webmaster, has been hard at work to create the program and streamline the process for entering this outstanding event!

I will be keeping the chapter adjudications chairs updated on a regular basis with reminders, changes or improvements to adjudications. Please thank your chapter chair for taking on this task, and know that I appreciate EVERYONE who contributes and participates in WSMTA Adjudications.

ERTIFICATION CORNER

Isn't it amazing how fast time goes!!?? This is the 17th column I've written for the Clarion. My granddaughter is 11 months old as you read this. My youngest is starting his senior year of college this month. And the summer (such as it was in Seattle) is now a thing of the past! The fall is here again with its many colored leaves, changing weather (okay not for Seattle—we'll just settle for more wet-ness) and noticeable shortening of days. Once again I look forward to the start of the new studio year but wonder how I'll manage to get everything done!!

I constantly remind myself that there is plenty of time for the things that are important...family, friends, colleagues and students. It's not the "stuff" we do, but the people we do it with that I try to focus on. After all, choosing the perfect method books for a new beginning student probably isn't as important as sharing in the excitement of a six year old playing music at her first lesson. And encouraging, changing, experimenting, correcting, prodding, guiding, circling, highlighting, or flagging the notes, dynamics, phrasing, measures, and starting points in a piece. Being prepared for a festival, competition or adjudication is important, but perhaps not as important as sharing with a teenager a moment in time during their lesson when their voice and the voice of the composer speaks uniquely through the music being "worked on." Such a joy to experience those privileged moments!

Corresponding by phone, email and postal mail with colleagues inquiring about certification procedures, grant availability, and certification renewal steps is also a privilege and an honor—

your passion for music and teaching is inspiring to me.

If you have been considering certification perhaps NOW is the time to "do" it. It will take some work and will be an interesting, and perhaps frustrating journey. (Isn't everything at times?) But I think you'll find that the people you encounter along the way will lead to some of those privileged moments in your life. check out the MTNA certification site (www.mtna.org) and click on the certification tab at the top of the page, or contact me if you have questions or concerns about the process. There are still two WSMTA certification grants available to help out with your certification application fee. Enrichment



After my years in college I began teaching in the public schools. I spent most of those eight years teaching either first or second grade. Even after all the years since then, I find myself drawn to the back to school sales, feeling that I should be stocking up my classroom. Back in those days students learned their alphabet in first grade rather than in kindergarten as they do today. Perhaps that

is why my thoughts turn to the learning of the alphabet when I am thinking about "back to school."

For those piano students who have taken the summer off, it is also back to piano lesson time. Thinking about the alphabet, I began thinking of words important to our chosen career as piano teachers.

A – attitude. Are we anxious to get back to teaching? Are we ready to apply something new this year?

B – Balance seems to be important to all of us as we are continually trying to balance teaching, family, practicing, obligations to church and community. Our students also have this challenge in balancing school, sports, dance, lessons, practice, homework and social time. Has anyone out there found a way to help either teacher or student in the fine art of balance?

C - Communication. I believe this is so important in teaching. We communicate in so many ways, non-verbal body language speaks with greater volume than verbal. Is our studio a calm place where they can concentrate and feel comfortable? Do we balance the corrections with compliments?

D - Diligence in preparation is important for both the teacher and the student. Are our lesson plans well prepared or are we just flying by the seat of the pants? When I did my student teaching, those lesson plans were part of my grade just as much as what was observed by my teacher. Have any of you found a way to help students come to lessons well prepared, having practiced as you have assigned?

E - Enthusiasm has to be there on the part of the teacher first and then it can be transferred to the student. I well remember a teacher I had at college who was so enthusiastic about the music, the sound, life, nature.... well you get the point. I could hardly wait for my lessons. I know she taught me well with her teaching, but it is her enthusiasm that I can feel even now. Encouraging our students will help them feel they can accomplish their goals. I believe they need cheerleaders in today's world. Our example of continuing to learn will be something they can follow throughout their lives.

F - Fun can be had in each lesson. It does not all have to be somber to be serious. Look back at some of the workshops or conferences you have attended and how much you have enjoyed and learned when the presenter is having fun with their subject. How do you have fun in your studio? Another concern is finances. What do you do with lesson costs to survive financially in today's economy?

I am sure you already have the idea about connecting the alphabet and starting school and lessons. I will offer just one more for this instant gratification and entitlement generation. That suggestion is that the dictionary is the only place where they will find success coming before work!






