ear WSMTA members,

It's renewal time again... recent reminders from MTNA have shown up in my email and my 'snail' mail telling me the deadline is June 30th. I tend to treat these reminders like I do a magazine subscription—I ignore the first few. "Oh, yes, I need to do that, but I'm so busy right now! I'll do it later..."

Lately, I've been experimenting with the Pomodoro Technique as a task management strategy. I thought it might

be interesting to find out how long it would actually take me to renew my MTNA membership online, so I timed myself. Including the time to go fetch my wallet and credit card and return said item to its usual location, *renewing my dues took me just 5 minutes!* If you haven't renewed online before, I highly recommend this efficient option, both for you and the benefit of MTNA staff.

If you are 70 years or older, remember that you can renew as a senior member and save \$20/year. If you are a collegiate member, you pay just \$19 for your national dues. State and local dues are also very economical. AND—collegiate members have until October 1 to renew!

If you don't fall into one of those "special member" categories and funds are too tight to renew this year, consider applying for a state dues waiver, which will shave about \$40 off the bottom line. The confidential 1-page application form is easily located on the WSMTA member dashboard (log in for access).

After all the years I've been a member of this organization, I would never consider NOT renewing my dues. For me, the benefits of the programs I use far outweigh the annual cost, not just for me personally, but for my students and my local and state affiliates as well. This past year, while serving as your president, I've become ever more aware of the value of "hidden" benefits, such as liability insurance for public events (local chapter recitals, workshops and events for our students, meetings, etc.). I could never afford to cover the cost of all these vital services on my own as an independent teacher. Finally, the knowledge and insights of our national staff, particularly CEO Gary Ingle, have been invaluable to me on numerous occasions this past year. I am eternally grateful.

Please invite teachers in your community to a meeting or event. The #1 reason members joined our organization is because they were invited. The #1 reason they are still a member is because they have found continual opportunities for professional development and cherished colleagues and friends.

Studio Technology News: Websites 101

or music teachers who have been in the business more than 15 years, it's a readily apparent fact:

Although plenty of things haven't changed about music teaching in recent decades, some things certainly have. It's no

doubt mind-boggling to young teachers that I used to dedicate a portion of my budget for my business entry in the yellow pages of the phone book. The

modern equivalent of the phone book is the web search, and if you don't have a website for your studio yet then here are a few tips to consider:

1. Websites are useful for attracting new students and

much more. You may have a waiting list of students and not be actively looking for more referrals, but a website can elevate your business as well as music teaching as a whole. Your affiliation with your local chapter, WSMTA, and MTNA can all be publicly viewable on your website. Likewise, if you choose to publicly post your biography or a music philosophy statement, the public will be better informed of the importance and relevance of the musical arts, and your broader and interconnected professional role.

2. Websites serve as terrific communication hubs for your current

clients. Depending on the platform you use, you may be able to publish pages that offer important information to your existing families in a format conveniently accessible to them...thereby saving you time and effort. When all your relevant information is located in one accessible place, you can continuously point families to your website for the answers to their questions.

3. Websites can host important studio information for your current clients. With a secure login feature, families could access your teaching calendar, online forms (see

Wufoo for an example) for registering for summer lessons or camps, or read FAQs on studio events or archived blog posts on important topics like policy information or instrument maintenance. You can also (with permission) post photos, videos and recordings from your events, or even accept payments online.

4. Many website building platforms are easy to use and free.

Wix, Weebly, GoDaddy, and WordPress are just a few of the many website

building platforms available, and Handmade Designs out of Boise, ID even has extensive experience working with MTNA teachers and affiliates. Depending on the features you want, you may be able to create a highly customized website entirely for free. My own website (although a nofrills example) was very easy to create, with clear templates



housed within Wix and options to customize it with plenty of photos, audio and video recordings. With just an initial time and energy investment to create the website, the maintenance commitment may be no more than just a few hours per year, and then your entire studio can reap the benefits!
