Priorities for successful collaboration.

- 1. Rhythmic support and harmonic support.
- 2. Understanding which part is most important when
- 3. Learning to read and interpret body language, gesture, breathing, bowing, conducting, etc
- 4. Setting tempos, and figuring out who is responsible
- 5. Learning to mark up your score breath marks, tempo changes, fermatas, accidentals, etc
- 6. Figuring out what can be left out, if necessary. The goal is not correctness, the goal is success.
- 7. Understanding balance in piano accompaniment, it is often very different from solo playing
- 8. Looking and listening, being flexible, being willing to "unlearn" some of what you have practiced
- 9. Practicing communicating encouragement and trust
- 10. Developing a sense of humor and self-forgiveness because things WILL go wrong
